Reflections on True Friendship

- 1 Is childhood the golden time for making real friends? Can you bring old relationships back? The other day, I read a novel by William Maxwell- "So Long, See You Tomorrow"- and I realized that it reflects the true meaning of friendship; it is the strong bond, the constant availability, and the **everlasting** promise that starts at the age of twelve and remains forever.
- 2 My great friend at that age was Mark MacDonald. In those early days, Mark was my only companion and support: whatever happened at home, Mark would always be there to make my **gloomy** day a bright one. We would wake up at dawn to wander over the fields, scan the beaches for coins, climb the hills together and sit there comparing our future plans.
- 3 Having not seen Mark for thirty years, I recently tried to find him again, but in vain. I surfed the internet thoroughly, but I found nothing about him. I even checked death certificates, fearing that my old friend might have died. Eventually, I drove to the neighbourhood where we once lived, but he wasn't there. I looked up at the window of my old house, remembering how I used to shine a torch from there to Mark's bedroom. Two flashes meant goodnight. Three flashes meant see you tomorrow.
- 4 I believe that technology has changed the meaning of friendship. My daughter is twelve and most things that happen to her are photographed and documented. She has over 100 Facebook friends, and she says, as many other youngsters do, she doesn't know half of them. Being an active follower on social media, she and her so-called "friends" get in touch, discuss likes and dislikes, watch and sometimes even share each other's videos and posts on occasions and ceremonies. Unfortunately, this kind of what those youngsters call "friendship" is a **widespread** phenomenon to which they are blindly attached all over the world. Social media has transformed this **pleasant** relationship into terrible shallowness related to one's self-image and status updates.
- 5 Well, as the late Muhammad Ali said, "Friendship is the hardest thing in the world to explain. It's not something you learn in school. But if you haven't learned the meaning of friendship, you really haven't learned anything." It is something beyond achievement or romance, money or technology, religion or reputation. That's why I miss my old friend Mark MacDonald. I was never photographed with him, but in difficult times, I will imagine him in front of me, a living guarantee that there will always be someone in life who knows the real you. When all the machines are off, and when all the chips are down, I see his light. Three flashes.
