Third Subject: Text

Man is characterized by being <u>conscious</u>, and he is able to think. This means – what he is and how he could be – he exists for himself (i.e. he is conscious). Things in nature do not exist except immediately and in one way, whereas man, because he is a spirit, he has a <u>dual existence</u>: he exists as <u>other things in nature</u> from one part, and he exists for himself from another part; he contemplates, he realizes himself and he thinks, and he is not a thinking spirit except through this activity that <u>constitutes his existence for himself.</u> (Conscious of himself)

This consciousness of the self is acquired <u>in two ways:</u> <u>first</u>, <u>theoretically</u>, as he should refer to himself in order to be aware of (he knows) all his <u>internal inclinations</u>; in general he contemplates...

<u>Second</u>, in a <u>practical way</u>, man constitutes himself through his <u>practical activities</u>... This need to modify the external world is <u>already imprinted</u> in the first drives of the child; a little child who throws pebbles in a stream, he admires the circles that form on the surface of the water; he actually admires a scene that is the benefit of his personal activity.
