Self-Confidence and Success

1 Self-confidence can be defined as the strong belief in yourself and your abilities. It is basically freedom from doubt. It is something that you develop by yourself. Self-confidence is an important characteristic that helps you achieve your goals and live a healthy and happy life. Besides, a self-confident person has a great opportunity to be independent, eager, optimistic, loving, and positive. As a result, success will be the **companion** of such a person.

2 Once, there was a businessman who had lost all his money and was in deep **debt**. He could see no way out because creditors and suppliers were always after him demanding payments. He was under much **stress**! The businessman felt as if the whole world was collapsing; he was helpless and unable to solve his problem. He sat on the park bench, head in hands, wondering if anything could save his company from bankruptcy. Out of nowhere, an old man appeared before him. "I can see that something is troubling you," he said. After listening to the businessman's problem, the old man said, "I believe I can help you." First, he asked the businessman about his name. Then, he wrote out a check and pushed it into his hand, saying, "Take this money. Meet me here at this same park exactly one year from today, and you can pay me back at that time."

3 Suddenly, the businessman found out that there was in his hand a check for \$500,000, signed by John D. Rockefeller, one of the richest men in the world. "I can erase my money worries in an instant!" he realized. However, the businessman decided to put the check in his safe. He thought that keeping it there might give him strength to work out a way to save his business.

4 Now that the businessman felt optimistic, he regained his self-confidence and started working out solutions to find suitable ways to pay back his debts. Within a few months, he was out of debt and started to make money once again.

5 One year later, he returned to the same park with the uncashed check. At the agreed-upon time, the old man appeared again. Just as the businessman was about to hand back the check and share his success story, a nurse came running up and grabbed the old man. "I am so glad I found him!" she cried. "I hope he hasn't been bothering you. You know, he has lost his **memory**; he often forgets all about himself, and he leaves the elderly home alone and tells people he's the rich John D. Rockefeller." The nurse said these words and led the man back.

6 The shocked businessman just stood there, sinking in his deep thoughts! All year long, he'd been wheeling and dealing, buying and selling, for he was convinced that he had half a million dollars in his safe. At that moment, he realized that it wasn't the money, real or imagined, that had turned his life around; it was his self-confidence that gave him the **power** to achieve anything he went after.

7 To sum up, self-confidence is one of the most important traits that help you overcome difficulties and lead a successful life. Everything is easy for those who stay calm and strong when facing any upcoming situation. There are many people who struggle at some point in their life, but if they stay confident enough and trust their abilities, they can achieve whatever they want.
